There are a wealth of videos students can watch and then complete comprehension activities about. There are games to practise vocabulary and exercises to improve grammar too.  Make vocabulary flashcards and arrange them by topic. Writing the French/German/Spanish word on one side and the English word on the other is a really good tip.  Record yourself saying the oral exam questions and play them back to check you understand what they are asking. Then, pause and answer, ensuring you are using your Top 21 or Top 30 features and two tenses in each answer.  Use the purple Pearson revision guide and workbook - aim to work through 4-6 pages a week. Use the contents page to highlight each topic by confidence level (very confident, confident, need to revise)  Work back through your textbook and translate all the reading texts into English. For any words you don't know, make cards for them!  Come to weekly after school revision sessions with your teacher.  Arrange to meet the language assistant to do some speaking practice.
